

Stormont Estate

Home to Northern Ireland's Parliament Buildings, Stormont Estate is unquestionably steeped in political history but also boasts beautiful gardens, woodland walking trails, play park and impressive views of the city. Guided tours of Parliament Buildings are available.

Police Museum

Charting Northern Ireland's

unique and often contentious policing history, the Police Museum displays uniforms, equipment, medals and archives from the early 1800s to the present day, as well as weapons used by police and against the police over the years. Guided tours are available.

BALLYHACKAMORE

Ballyhackamore

Recognised by The Sunday Times as 'The Best Place to Live in Northern Ireland', Ballyhackamore boasts a vibrant village atmosphere with thriving independent retailers, bars, cafes and restaurants offering unique dining experiences.

NORTH ROAD

Cyprus Avenue

Immortalised by east Belfast's own Van Morrison, Cyprus Avenue is a pleasant, leafy suburban street and is a perfect starting point to explore on foot other places made famous by 'Van the Man' including Hyndford Street, The Hollow and Orangefield.

HOLYWOOD ARCHES

C.S. Lewis Square

Located where the Comber Greenway meets the Connswater Community Greenway, this public space boasts a series of impressive Narnia-themed sculptures celebrating the work of Clive Staples Lewis who was born just streets away.

CONNSWATER

EastSide Visitor Centre

Packed full of information on EastSide's key attractions, famous faces and places, EastSide Visitor Centre is your gateway to exploring east Belfast. Pick up walking maps, local books, artwork and crafts or chat to a local volunteer 'greeter' in JACK Coffee Bar.

TEMPLEMORE AVENUE

Templemore Baths

First opened in 1893, Templemore Baths is the last remaining Victorian Baths still functioning in Ireland today. This stunning example of Victorian architecture is steeped in social history and a guided tour of the building is highly recommended.

SHORT STRAND

Short Strand

Explore east Belfast's Short Strand to see how political and religious divisions have shaped this community through the years. Visit Bryson Street Peace Wall, St Matthew's Parish Church and the Republican Memorial Garden.





BELFAST CITY CENTRE

There's a real buzz around Belfast City Centre these days and with a thriving shopping district, fascinating museums, libraries and public buildings, Michelin star restaurants and atmospheric pubs, bars and live music venues, it's easier to see why.

WELLINGTON PLACE

Linen Hall Library

Open free to the public, the Linen Hall Library is Belfast's oldest library and a treasure trove of world-renowned collections. There's also a cafe and calendar full of cultural events and activities.

Belfast City Hall

Open to the public seven days a week, Belfast City Hall boasts a fascinating exhibition (available in multiple languages) charting the history of the city and its people. There is also a gift shop and coffee shop located in the east wing. Free guided tours available daily.

The Belfast Barge

Learn about Belfast's rich maritime heritage aboard the city's first and only floating museum, moored at Lanyon Quay. Open Tuesday to Saturday, all year round.

MAY STREET

St George's Market

Home to over 250 traders each weekend, St George's Market is not only one of the largest indoor markets in the UK and Ireland but it is also one of the city's oldest visitor attractions. The food market is open from 6am every Friday and on weekends the market offers arts, crafts and unique handmade gifts as well as plenty of local food, drink and entertainment.

Páirc Radharc na bhFeá **Áras Uí Chonghaile**

BEECHVIEW PARK

Áras Uí Chonghaile is a modern, inspirational, visitor centre that tells the story of James Connolly, from his birth in Edinburgh in 1868 to his death in Dublin in 1916. Explore the visitor centre exhibition, relax in the Hatch Coffee, learn in the library and be inspired by events in our conference and event suite.

Páirc na bhFál

Belfast City Cemetery

This Victorian cemetery opened in 1869 and was to be Belfast's first crossdenominational burial ground. The cemetery is the city's largest with around 250,000 burials and, curiously, has a sunken wall dividing the Protestant and Catholic sections. Many of Belfast's most prominent figures are buried here including Sir Edward Harland, Daniel Joseph Jaffe and members of C.S. Lewis's family.

Falls Park / Bog Meadows

Visit the UNESCO-awarded Bog Meadows Nature Reserve, a green oasis boasting a mosaic of species-rich meadows, reedbeds, ponds and hedgerows. Or head to Falls Park where you can soak up incredible nature right in the heart of west Belfast.

GLENGOLAND Gleann Gabhláin

Colin Glen Forest Park & SkyTrek

Colin Glen Forest Park is a beautiful wooded glen located in the Colin area of West Belfast in the heart of the Belfast Hills. Visitors can expect to enjoy beautiful woodland walks, adventurous outdoor activities at SkvTrek and superb leisure facilities.

PRONI

Interested in your family or local history? Then make a bee line for the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI). It's the official archive for NI and holds over three million public and privately deposited records. Enjoy talks and lectures on research and engage with the exhibitions. nidirect.gov.uk/proni

SS Nomadic

Walk the decks of the last remaining White Star vessel. Famous as a tender for Titanic, and a quarter of her size in every dimension, guests can marvel at the original ornate doors, panels, plasterwork and staircases that greeted first and second-class passengers on board, as well as see what life was like as a crew. A visit onboard SS Nomadic is included with a Titanic Experience ticket.

QUEENS ROAD

Titanic Belfast

A 'must see' visit in any tour of Belfast. This iconic, six-floor building, with nine interactive galleries that explore the sights, sounds, smells and stories of RMS Titanic, as well as the City and people which made her. It is located right beside the historic slipway where this worldfamous ship was built.


CATALYST INC.
